## Rights Respecting School

We have our Rights Respecting Assessment this half term and we want to achieve this award. We shall continue to promote different articles each week. All the students will be discussing and learning more about their rights and responsibilities throughout this year.

Next week we are focusing on Article 2: All children have all of the rights in the convention. The students will learn that with this right comes the responsibility to respect others rights as well.

Please support us by using the language of rights and responsibilities with your children, asking them what they have been learning about.

## School dinners

We continue to have very successful meals this year with a fabulous menu and enjoyable lunches.

The price of a school meal remains at £2.20 each day, which is £11 a week and must be paid on Friday for the next week or Monday for that week. If you are not eligible for a Free School Meal please ensure you pay for all meals in advance. If your child is in Reception, Y1 or Y2, they are entitled to a free school meal, but **it is vital that you still let us know whether you qualify for free school meals as this is how we are funded by the government. If you do not give us this information, we shall get no money.**

If you wish your child to have a packed lunch, they must stick to this option for the **whole of the half term, Monday to Friday.** The kitchen cannot cater for daily or weekly changes.

## School uniform

Please ensure that all of your children come to school in full uniform.



Navy sweatshirt or cardigan with the school logo. White collared shirt. Grey or navy trousers or skirt. Black, plain school shoes – no trainers, logos or plimsolls. Black, grey or white socks or tights.



If you wish your child to wear a shirt or leggings underneath their uniform, it must be plain white and not be able to be seen.



House colour (red, green, blue or yellow) t-shirt and blue shorts or track bottoms for PE.

We also have book bags, rucksacks, fleeces, polo shirts and hats available from the school office.

## Contact and Permission Forms

Please ensure that we have your most up to date contact details by checking with Mrs. Gibbs in the office by Friday 14<sup>th</sup> September.

We will allow students just in Y5 and Y6 to go home on their own, but only with your permission, otherwise they need to be collected by you. If you wish your child to go home independently, you need to complete a permission form. Please come and get a form from the office and return it completed to Mrs. Gibbs.

## Clubs

After school clubs will begin in the week beginning Monday 17<sup>th</sup> September and finish in the week beginning 10<sup>th</sup> December. The clubs letter will go out next week, please make sure you sign and return it as soon as possible to give your child the best chance of getting a place at the club they want.

We also have an external provider of Karate every Wednesday after school. If you wish your child to join, please speak to Mrs. Gibbs.

You will be able to ask any questions that you might have and discuss any issues with Mrs. Harwood and Mrs. Hudson.

On Friday 14<sup>th</sup>, at 2.50pm, we shall be holding our **elections** for the roles of Head Boy; Head

Girl; Deputy Head Boy; Deputy Head Girl; Assistant Head Boy and Assistant Head Girl. The children who are standing for election will be expected to give a short presentation on why they think they are a good candidate and what their aspirations are for The Alton School. Everyone will be able to vote, including all the parents who attend this assembly, so please come and cast your vote. As the children will need time to return to class to vote before they go home, this assembly will begin on time and we will not be able to admit any latecomers because this is too disturbing to the children who are giving their speeches.
